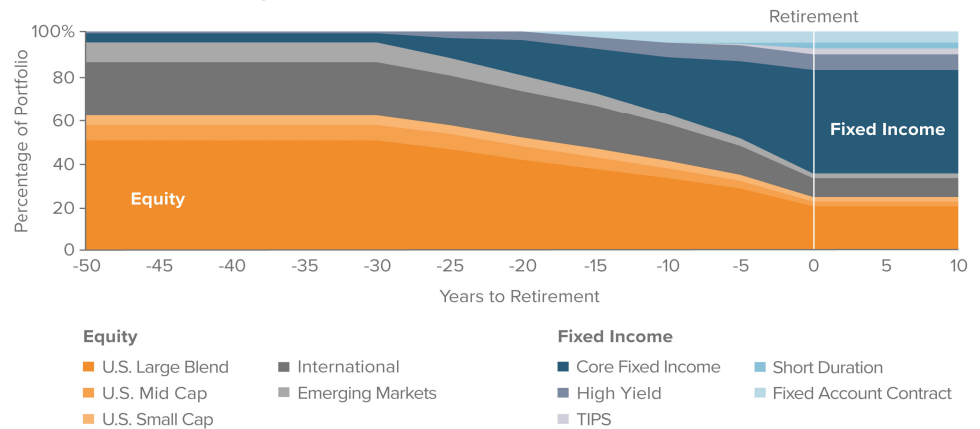

## Fund highlights

The Voya Index Solution Portfolios are a diversified target date portfolio suite designed to evolve alongside a participant's career based on their retirement date and risk profile. The suite invests passively managed investment options that track different market indices around the world. The Portfolios gradually adjust over time to become more conservative as the target retirement year approaches. The Voya Index Solution 2025 Portfolio is designed for people who plan to begin living their retirement goals in the years 2023 to 2027.

## Investment objective

Until the day prior to its Target Date the Portfolio seeks to provide total return consistent with an asset allocation targeted at retirement in approximately 2025. On the Target Date, the Portfolio's investment objective will be to seek to provide a combination of total return and stability of principal consistent with an asset allocation targeted to retirement.

The Portfolio may periodically deviate from the Target Allocation (+/- 10% relative to the current Target Allocation). **Glossary of Terms:** **Alpha** measures the difference between a fund's actual return and its level of risk as measured by beta. **Beta** measures the Fund's volatility relative to the overall market. **Information Ratio** measures the returns above the returns of a benchmark to the volatility of those returns. **R-Squared** is the way in which a percentage of a portfolio's total returns represents the portfolio's beta measure. **Sharpe Ratio** is a risk-adjusted measure calculated using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. **Standard Deviation** is a measure of the degree to which an individual probability value varies from the distribution mean.

The **Morningstar Rating™** for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating™

for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating™ metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Rankings do not take sales loads into account. The **Fi360 Fiduciary Score®** is a peer percentile ranking of an investment against a set of quantitative due diligence criteria indicative of prudent fiduciary management. Each investment is evaluated against nine individual factors and thresholds, with points allotted if it fails a particular criterion.
